
# SKIPPING ROCKS BY SIMONE BRADFORD

# SKIPPING ROCKS:

## **SUPPLIES:**

LOW VOLUME MODERN FABRIC

MODERN PRINT FABRIC

**CONTRASTING THREAD** 

SELF HEALING MAT

QUILTER'S RULER

**ROTARY CUTTER** 


**SCISSORS** 

PINS

SPRAY STARCH

**IRON & IRONING BOARD** 

SEWING MACHINE



## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Starch all fabric before cutting. This will help prevent the block from stretching in Step 4.
- From low volume modern fabric cut one 8"x8" square.
- Cut out paper templates A, B & C. Using rotary cutter & paper templates A, B & C as guides, cut out corresponding modern print fabric.
- A wafer thin light box or a sunny window can be used for this part. Use **SKIPPING ROCKS BLOCK TEMPLATE** for proper placement of stones. Pin fabric A, B & C onto 8"x8" square of low volume fabric.
- Raw edge appliqué A, B & C onto low volume fabric with contrasting thread. Overlap 3 stitching lines as show on SKIPPING ROCKS BLOCK TEMPLATE.
- Trim off extra fabric from behind the raw edge appliqué with scissors.
- Blocks can be trimmed/squared to 7 ¾" x 7 ¾" if needed.

  If you are making the blocks for Block Lotto DO NOT trim/square up blocks at this time.
